
### SENIOR CLASS OF 141

#### MORGAN'S FOOTBALLERS WIN STATE CHAMPIONSHIP


MORGAN'S TROJANS HAD THEIR BEST SEASON IN HISTORY, WHEN THEY WON THE SUMMIT DISTRICT TITLES AND THEN WENT ON TO WIN THE STATE "B" CHAMPIONSHIP.

The Trojans opened their season by whipping Judge Memorial 27-0, in a one sided contest at Salt Lake City. The next team to fall victim to Troy's hard charging line and fast stepping backfield was Wasatch. The game was very fast, colorful, and the Trojans came out on top by a score of 14-0. Morgan's next contest was with the Miners at Park City. The students of the student body went with the team and they watched a very thrilling encounter. Morgan was on the short end of a 6-0 count at half time. Morgan started to move in the last half and it wasn't long before Troy had the scores tied 6-6 all. It stayed this way nearly all through the game. With one minute to go, Park City started a desperation passing attack, but Wayne Crouch took a pass in mid-air and raced 50 yards to a touchdown, and thus, Morgan won the ball game 12-6.

OUR TROJANS HAD TO TAKE TWO STEPS IN WINNING THEIR FIRST STATE TITLE. FIRST, THEY HAD TO SHIP THE BINGHAM MINERS AND THEN THEY HAD TO GET BY THE RICHFIELD WILDCATS. THEY DID THESE THINGS IN GREAT STYLE. THE BINGHAM GAME WAS A RARE SIGHT TO BEHOLD. IT WAS ALSO ONE OF THE BEST, IF NOT THE BEST EVER PLAYED ON THE MORGAN GRIDIRON. THE TRO-JANS PLAYED 60 MINUTES OF HARD, FAST FOOTBALL. EXCEPT FOR ONE PART IN THE EARLY MOMENTS OF THE GAME, WHICH CARRIED THE BALL TO THE MORGAN 25 YD. LINE, THE TROJANS HELD THE UPPER HAND. WHEN THE DUST WAS CLEARED AWAY AND DARKNESS FELL OVER MORGAN VALLEY, THE TROJANS HAD WON FROM THEIR FAVORED RIVALS BY A SCORE OF 14-0.

Now the Trojans had to play the Rickfield Wildcats in the U. of U. stadium for the state "B" Championship. During the first half of the game the Trojans were outplayed and the half time score was a different story. The Trojans outplayed and outrushed the Wildcats. Richfield was limited to a total of 5 yards gained not a single first down. The Trojans, led by Kent Rich, marched up and down the field in the second half as if there was no Richfield squad on the field, and when the final gun sounded Morgan had won its first state title in history by a score of 20-7.


DURING THE TWO MONTH'S TESTING PERIOD, THE MORGAN TEAM PLAYED SOME VERY EXCITING GAMES. PARK CITY WAS BEATEN BOTH TIMES WE MET THEM, WITH THE SCORES RUNNING 28-25 AND 30-28. NORTH SUMMIT SUCCUMBED TO THE HARD-HITTING TROJANS IN TWO CLOSELY FOUGHT GAMES, ONE OF WHICH REQUIRED AN EXTRAFERIOD WITH THE SCORES 27-21 AND 38-32. WASATCH HIGH WAS DEFEATED TWICE 24-14 AND 35-25.

WE ENCOUNTERED A LITTLE DIFFICULTY WHEN THE TROJANS MET THE BULLDOGS, SPLITTING HONORS WITH JUDGE MEMORIAL. THEY WON THE FIRST GAME AT MORGAN 31-23. MORGAN RETALIATED AND BEAT THEM ON THEIR FLOOR 24-22. SOUTH SUMMIT DEFEATED US IN OUR FIRST ENCOUNTER 45-41, BUT FORFEITED THE GAME BE-CAUSE THEY PLAYED AN INELIGIBLE MAN. 
### PHYSICAL SCIENCE IN THIS SCHOOL
