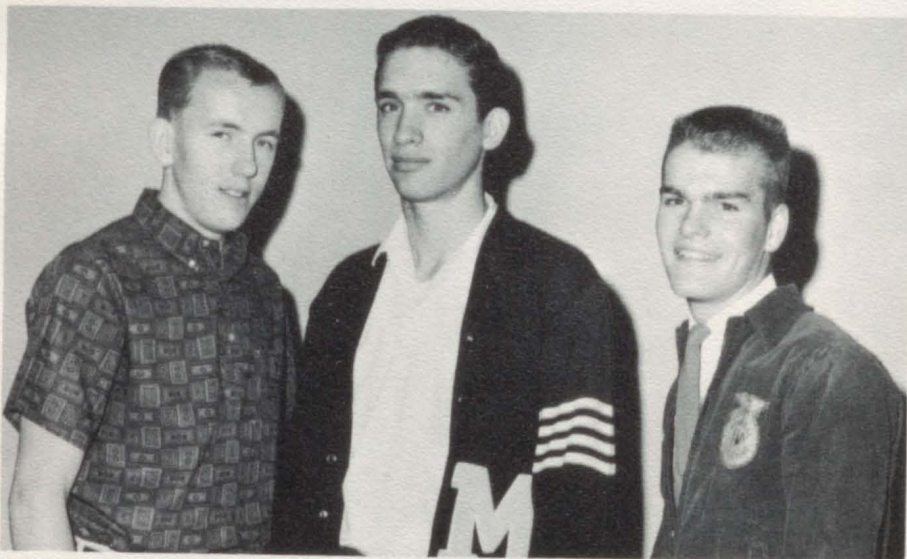
The Utopian proudly commends the ushers who have done an excellent job throughout the school year, especially acting as receptionists to visitors attending the basketball games.

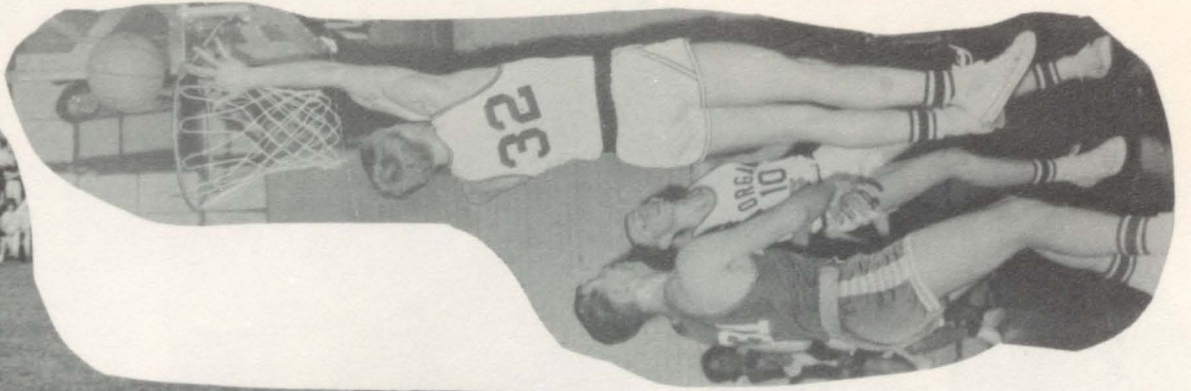

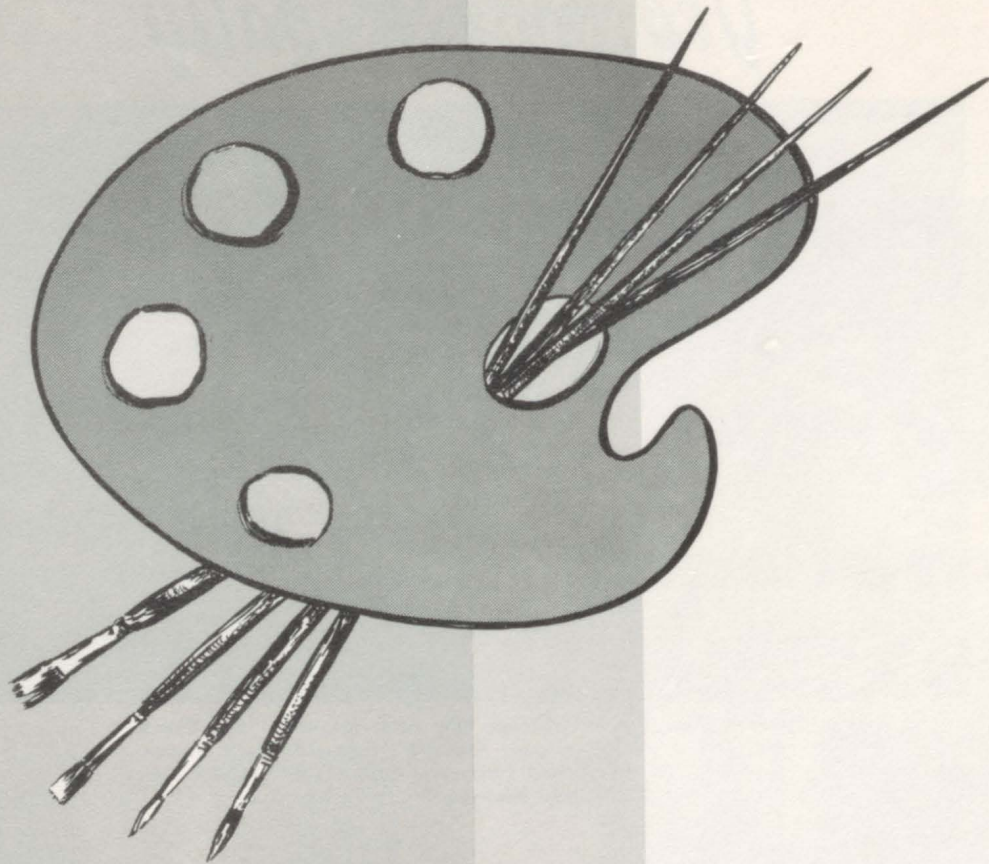
