For we love thee, our Morgan High.

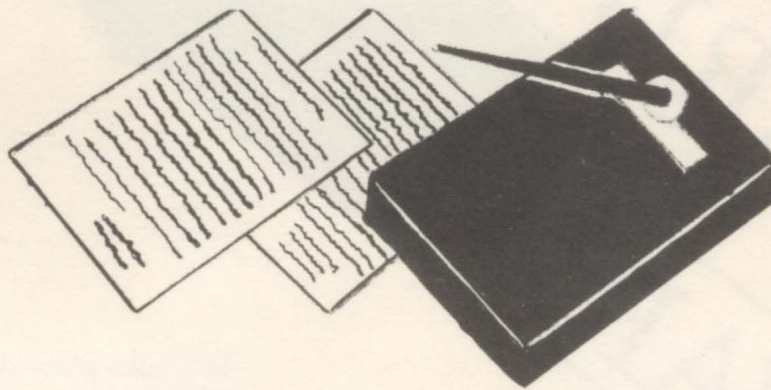

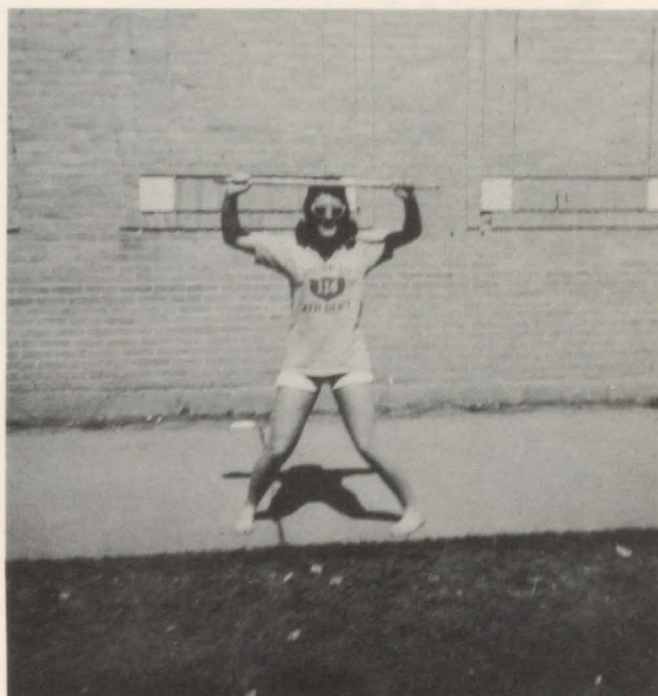


## Girls' Day
